Dear Shareholders,

Your Directors have pleasure in presenting the Sixteenth Annual Report for the year ended 31st March 2010.

Performance:

During the year under review, the Company recorded a turnover of Rs. 359.77 Lacs as compared to Rs. 38.19 Lacs recorded during the previous year. The Company recorded a net profit after tax of Rs. 5.94 Lacs as compared to profit of Rs. 1.67 Lacs during the previous year.

Dividend:

The strength of your Company lies in identification, execution and successful implementation of the projects in the real estate space. To strengthen the long-term prospects and ensuring sustainable growth in assets and revenue, it is important for your Company to evaluate various opportunities in the different business verticals in which your Company operates. Your Company currently has several projects under implementation and continues to explore newer opportunities. Your Board of Directors, considers this be in the strategic interest of the Company and believe that this will greatly enhance the long-term shareholders' value. In order to fund these projects in its development, expansion and implementation stages, conservation of funds is of vital importance. Therefore, your Directors have not recommended any dividend for the financial year 2009-10.

Change in Share Capital:

To augment its long term resources and in order to enable the Company to raise the resources, Company has increased its authorized share capital from Rs. 8.50 Cr. to Rs. 16.00 Cr. by way of Postal Ballot on 13th April, 2010 and Company has issued 86,99,600 Warrants convertible into equity shares of Rs. 10/- each at a premium of Rs. 5/- per share on April 27, 2010, to the promoters and / or bodies corporate(s), individual(s) or others. Warrants will convert in Equity Shares before expiry of 18 months from the date of allotment of the warrants. After conversion paid up and subscribed capital of Company would be increase from Rs. 7.30 Cr. to Rs. 16.00 Cr.

Segment Performance:

At present Company is engaged in the business of real estate development and infrastructure activities and there is no separate reportable segment.

Listing:

As on date all the 73,00,400 Equity Shares of the company are listed on the Bombay Stock Exchange Limited (BSE). The Listing fees have been paid to the Bombay Stock Exchange Limited (BSE) for the year 2010-11.

Depository:

Equity shares of the company are traded in D'mate form as well as in physical form. For dematerialization of shares Company has connectivity with the National Securities Depository Ltd. (NSDL) and Central Depository Services (India) Ltd. (CDSL).

Fixed Deposits:

Your company has not accepted any deposits from public during the year under review and as such, no amount of principle or interest was outstanding as on the balance sheet date.

Bairagi retires by rotation in accordance with the provisions of Articles of Association of the Company and being eligible, offers himself for re-appointment at the ensuing Annual General Meeting. Necessary resolution relating to Director who is seeking re-appointment is included in the Notice of Annual General Meeting. The Board of Directors recommends the re-appointment of Mr. P.D. Bairagi.

Management Discussion & Analysis

Industry Structure and Developments:

Construction activity is an integral part of a country's infrastructure and industrial development. It includes hospital, schools, townships, offices, houses and other buildings; urban infrastructure viz water supply, sewerage and drainage etc.; highways, roads, ports, railways, airports; power systems; irrigation system and agriculture system; telecommunication system etc., it becomes the basic input for socio-economic development due to covering of wide spectrum. Besides, the construction industry generates substantial employment and provides a growth impetus to other sectors through backward and forward linkages. The construction sector is one of the largest employers in the country. The main advantage of the construction sector in employment generation lies in the fact that it absorbs rural labour and unskilled workers.

Indian Economy And Industry Overview:

Despite the global meltdown effect of last two years, India is expected to be the second fastest growing economy in the Asia Pacific Region. The productivity growth rate of Indian economy is estimated to be around 8% and it is expected to sustain until 2020. Infrastructure integrated with real estate development has been the backbone of such sustained growth and continues to be the focal point for our economy.

Economic Overview (2009-10)

- The overall GDP forecast for 2010-11 is estimated at 8.1%.
- Soaring CPI due to increase in food prices, has undermined consumer spending. RBI has resorted to monetary tightening in an effort to curb inflationary pressure on the economy.
- Due to improvement in the investment scenario and FDI touching USD 2 billion in January 2010, it can be assured that India has escaped the global crisis and confidence has been gained in the economic prospects.
- Government has also started withdrawing the cautionary measures taken during the global crisis. In the recently announced Union Budget 2010-11, government proposed reversal of many measures as it targets to bring fiscal

deficit to 5.5% in 2010-11 from 6.7% in 2009-10.

Industry Overview

Real Estate sector witnessed a complete turnaround with signs of economic stabilization and moderate growth in global economic performance in second and third quarter of 2009. Property markets in India began to exhibit signs of revival during this time. With the return of liquidity in the real estate sector and firm prices in the recent months, cash flows of realty players improved resulting in renewed construction of stalled projects and a few new launches as well.

The investment environment, however, remains challenging. Private equity transactions in 2009-10 fell by over 60-70% compared to peak volumes reported in 2008-09. Activity in 2009-10 remain focused primarily towards residential, with disappointing flows into commercial properties.

Indian Real-estate industry has become one of the biggest investment sectors over the past few years. Currently, it plays a major role in shaping the country's economy. This sector is witnessing a marked boon owing to changing trends and developments. Some of the major factors responsible for the current upward movement of the Indian real estate graph are as follows:

- **Steady expansion and development in the IT sector of India:** In India there has been a constant expansion in the IT sector. Various MNC's and corporate houses have come up that have given way to the growth in the real-estate sector especially in the commercial property sector. This has also provided better employment opportunities to the people of India and thus helping in the overall growth of the Indian economy and subsequently in the growth of the real estate.
- **Adoption of Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) policy:** The growth in the real estate sector of India largely depends on its government policies. Currently, the government of India has adopted Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) policy, which has allowed the coming in of the foreign investors in the Indian real estate market. Some of the world's famous builders are taking keen interest in investing in the Indian real-estate market. Coming in of foreign builders'

promises better prospects in the Indian real estate industry in terms of regulatory policy, efficient management, and the use of more advanced technology. This ensures that the Indian real estate has a brighter future.

- **Easy access to bank loans:** Today, various national and multinational banks are present in India that has made the home/property loans easily accessible. So, buying a property is not difficult even for those belonging to middle-class. Thus, it has enabled the overall growth of the Indian real estate.

Today, the investors from all the major sectors are getting attracted towards the Indian the real-estate sector. This sector has become a centre of attention amongst all the corporate sectors of India. Owing to all the recent developments in the Indian real estate sector, it has moved five places upwards in world rankings.

Opportunities and Threats

The improvement in the global economic and liquidity situation coupled with more stable commodity prices, the stimulus packages by the Indian Government and various Governments globally provides an opportunity for growth for the infrastructure sector. At the same time, the real estate market has been affected by depressed prices during the year and there could be a spill-over effect.

Segment Performance:

At present Company is engaged in the business of real estate development and infrastructure activities and there is no separate reportable segment.

Risks and Concerns

Your Company has put a risk management framework in place post a comprehensive review of its risk management process. The review involved understanding the existing risk management initiatives businesses as also the relative control measures and arriving at the desired counter measures keeping in mind the risk appetite of the organization.

Macro economic factors including economic and political developments, natural calamities which

affect the industrial sector generally would also affect the businesses of your Company. Legislative changes resulting in changes in the taxes, duties and levies, whether local or central, also impact business performance and relative competitiveness of the businesses.

Future Outlook:

Real Estate sector is poised for growth across all segments led by increase in urbanisation across many cities in India. Macro factors like increase in per capita income, favourable direct tax policies, subsidy on home loans have maintained the demand of affordable housing.

Your Company's recent policies of creating affordable housing have been very successful. The Company is developing residential as well as commercial projects mainly in Indore (Madhya Pradesh) and Mumbai (Maharashtra).

Projects:

Your Company has started three residential multistoried building projects at Indore (M.P.), named as Hilton Tower, Orchid Residency, Solitaire Park and one plotting project named as Shri Krishna Avenue. These all above said projects are at advance stage of construction. Your Company has also entered into a joint venture with "M/s. AVANI BUILDCON" for a commercial project at Ghatkopar, Mumbai.

Your Company's vision is to create a company that in turn delivers value to its customers, shareholders and the society, developing quality assets across the country.

Internal control systems and their adequacy:

Your Company has a proper and adequate system of Internal Controls, to ensure that all assets are safeguarded and protected against loss from unauthorised use or disposal and commercial transactions are authorised, recorded and reported correctly. The internal control is supplemented by an extensive programme of internal, external audits and periodic review by the management. The system is designed to adequately ensure that financial and other records are reliable for presenting financial information and other data and maintaining accountability of assets.

Information Security:

Your Company accords great importance to the security of its information assets and has the requisite security controls and checks. Adequate storage and back up system is in place to ensure security and availability of data at all times.

Material developments in human resources:

There are no material developments in human resources.

Report on Corporate Governance

(PART OF THE DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE PERIOD ENDED ON 31ST MARCH 2010)

Corporate Governance essentially is set of standards, which aims to improve the Company's efficiency, effectiveness and social responsibility. The concept emphasizes on transparency, accountability, independence and integrity of the management, with focus on public interest in particular. It further inspires and strengthens investors' confidence by ongoing commitment to overall growth of the Company.

The Company's Corporate Governance philosophy encompasses not only regulatory and legal requirements, such as the terms of listing agreement with stock exchanges, but also several voluntary practices at a superior level of business ethics, effective supervision and enhancement of shareholders' value.

The Company believes that timely disclosures, transparent accounting policies and a strong and independent Board go a long way in protecting shareholders trust while maximizing long-term corporate value.

Our philosophy on Corporate Governance begins with our Board of Directors.

- More than half of the Board of Directors comprises of Independent Directors.
- A Non- Executive Director chairs the Audit Committee.
- The Board has established terms of reference for its operation and the operation of Audit Committee in line with clause 49 of the listing agreement and section 292A of the Companies Act, 1956.

In compliance with the disclosure requirements of Clause 49 of the Listing Agreement, the details are set out as under:

1. BOARD OF DIRECTORS:

A) Composition:

The current policy is to have an appropriate mix of executive and independent directors to maintain the independence of the Board, and to separate the Board functions of governance and management. The Board

of Directors of the Company consist of seven directors, four of whom are non-executive independent directors thus making the 57% of the Board members as independent.

The Company has three Executive directors on the Board, consisting of managing director and two other whole-time directors. According to clause 49, if the chairman is Executive, at least 50% of the Board should consist of non-executive, independent directors. This provision is more than adequately met at Shri Krishna Devcon Limited. There are four non-executive directors and all of them are independent as defined by clause 49 which ensures a good blend of executive and independent directors and achieves the desired level of independence of the Board. All the non-executives directors are eminent businessman and Professionals having a wide range of expertise and experience in management, administration, business finance, law, education etc. which bring with them wide range of skills and experience to the Board.

B) Meetings and Attendance:

During the financial year 2009-10, the Board of Directors met Nine (9) times on the following dates: April 15, 2009, June 30, 2009, July 30, 2009, September 08, 2009, October 24, 2009, October 28, 2009, December 14, 2009, January 29, 2010 and March 11, 2010. The last Annual General Meeting of the Company was held on 26th September 2009.

The gap between any two meetings never exceeded four months as stipulated in the revised clause 49.

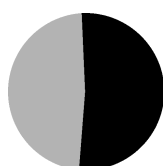

In view of clause 4 (iii) (a) of the companies (Auditor's Report) Order, 2003, clause 4 (iii) (b, c & d) are not applicable to the company.

- b) The Company had taken loan from parties covered in the register maintained under section 301 of the Companies Act, 1956.

The maximum amount involved during the year was Rs. 64,50,000/- and the year end balance of loans taken from such parties was Rs. 64,50,000/-.

- c) In our opinion and according to information and explanation given to us , the rate of interest and other terms and conditions for such loans are not prima facie prejudicial to the interest of the company.
- d) In respect of loans taken, repayment of the principal amount is as stipulated.

4. Internal Controls:-

In our opinion and according to the information and explanations given to us, there is an adequate internal control system commensurate with the size of the company and the nature of its business for the purchase of inventory and fixed assets and for the sale of goods . During the course of our audit, no major weakness has been noticed in the internal control system in respect of these areas.

5. Transactions with parties under section 301 of the Companies act, 1956:-

- a) Based upon the audit procedures applied by us and according to the information and explanations given to us, we are of the opinion that the particulars of contracts or arrangements referred to in section 301 of the Companies Act, 1956, have been entered in the register maintained under that section.
- b) In our opinion and according to the information and explanation to us , the transactions made in pursuance of contracts or arrangements entered in the register maintained under section 301 of the Companies Act, 1956 and exceeding the value of rupees five lakhs in respect of any party during the period have been made at prices which are reasonable having regard to the prevailing market prices at the relevant time.

6. Public Deposits:-

In our opinion and according to the information and explanations given to us, the company has not accepted any deposits from the public within the meaning of section 58 A, 58AA, or any other relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 1956 and the rules framed thereunder.

7. Internal Audit System:-

In our opinion, and according to information and explanation given to us, the company has an Internal Audit system commensurate with its size and the nature of its business.

8. Cost Records:-

According to the information and explanations given to us, the maintenance of cost records has not been prescribed by the Central Government under section 209 (1) (d) of the Companies Act, 1956 for any of the activities of the company.

9. Statutory Dues:-

- a) According to the information and explanations given to us, the Company is regular in depositing undisputed statutory dues, including dues pertaining to Income Tax, Cess and any other statutory dues with the appropriate authorities.
- b) According to the information and explanations given to us, no undisputed amount payable in respect of provident fund, income tax, wealth Tax, cess and other undisputed statutory dues were outstanding at the end of the year for a period of more than six months from the date they become payable.
- c) According to the information and explanations given to us there are no dues of Income Tax, Sales Tax, Wealth Tax, Service Tax, Customs Duty, Excise Duty or Cess outstanding on account of any dispute.

10. Accumulated Losses:-

The Company's accumulated losses at the end of the financial period, are less than fifty per cent of its net worth and it has not incurred any Cash losses during the financial period ended on that date or in the immediately preceding financial period.

11. Dues to Financial Institutions/Banks:-

The company has not defaulted in repayment of dues to any Financial Institution or Bank. The company has no debenture holders.

12. Loans against pledge of securities:-

According to the information and explanations given to us, and based on the documents and records produced to us, the company has not granted loans and advances on the basis of security by way of pledge of shares, debentures and other securities.

13. Applicability of provisions of special statutes:-

In our opinion and according to the information and explanations given to us, the nature of activities of the Company does not attract any special statute applicable to chit fund and nidhi / mutual benefit fund / Societies.

14. Investments :-

In respect of dealing/trading in shares, securities, debentures and other investments, in our opinion and according to the information and explanations given us, proper records have been maintained of the transactions and contracts and timely entries have been made therein. The shares, securities, debentures and other securities have been held by the Company, in its own name.

15. Guarantees:-

terms and conditions are prejudicial to the interest of the company does not arise.

16. Application of Funds raised from bank-:

The Company has applied the term loans obtained during the period for the purpose for which the said term loans were obtained.

17. Utilization of Funds-:

According to the information and explanations given to us, and on an overall examination of Balance Sheet of the company, fund raised on short term basis have *prima facie* not been used for long term investment.

18. Preferential Allotment of shares-:

Accounting Policies and notes forming part of the Balance Sheet as at and Profit and Loss Account for the year ended 31st March, 2010.**SCHEDULE "P"****I) Significant Accounting Policies****1) Basis of preparation of financial statements :**

The financial statements are prepared on the historical cost convention on an accrual basis and in accordance with Indian generally accepted accounting principles comprising the accounting standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India and the provisions of the Companies Act, 1956 as adopted consistently by the company.

2) Use of estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and the disclosure of contingent liabilities on the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Any revision to accounting estimates is recognised prospectively in current and future periods.

3) Fixed assets:

Fixed assets are stated historical cost less accumulated depreciation. Cost includes purchase price and all other attributable cost to bring the assets to its working condition for the intended use.

4) Depreciation:

Depreciation on fixed assets are provided for in accordance with schedule XIV of the Companies Act, 1956 on the straight line method. Depreciation on addition/deduction during the year has been provided on pro-rata basis.

5) Impairment of assets:

The company assesses at each balance sheet date whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If any such indication exists, the company estimates the recoverable amount of the asset. If such recoverable amount of the asset is less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount is reduced to its recoverable amount. The reduction is treated as an impairment loss and is recognised in the profit and loss account.

6) Investment:

Investment are classified as Long-term Investments and valued at cost. Provision for decline, in the value of investments is made wherever the decline is other than of a temporary nature.

7) Inventories:

- (i) Land is valued at cost. Cost includes cost of acquisition and all related costs.
- (ii) Work in progress are valued at cost. Cost includes cost of land/development rights, materials, construction, services, borrowing costs and other overheads relating to projects.

- (iii) Completed project/units and trading stock are valued at lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is determined by including cost of land/development rights, materials, services and other related overheads.

8) Revenue recognition:

- (a) Revenue from real estate sales is recognised when it is reasonably certain that the ultimate collection will be made and no significant uncertainty exist regarding the amount of consideration.

Revenue from sales of land / Plots are recognised upon transfer of all significant risk and rewards of ownership of such reale state property, as per the terms of the contracts entered into with buyers,which generally coincides with the timing of the sales contracts/ agrrements.

Revenue from real estate projects(construction activity) is recognised on the 'percentage of completion' method of accounting. Revenue is recognised,in relation to sold areas only,when the stage of completion of each project reaches a significant level which is estimated to be at least 30% of the total estimated construction cost of the project.Revenue is recognised in proportion that the construction cost incurred for work performed upto the reporting date bears to the estimated total construction cost. Land costs are not included for the purpose of computing the percentage of completion.

- (b) Dividend is recognised when the shareholders right to receive payment is established at the Balance Sheet date.

- (c) Other Income is accounted on accrual basis except where the receipt of income is uncertain.

9) Borrowing costs :

Borrwing cost relating to the acquisition/construction of a qualifying asset(including real estate projects) are considered as part of the cost of the asset/project.All other borrowing costs are treated as period cost and charged to the profit and loss account in the year in which incurred.

10) Accounting for taxes on income:

Provision for current tax is computed as per 'Total Income' returnable under the Income Tax Act,1961.

Deferred tax is recognised for all timing 'differences being the difference between taxable income and accounting income that originate in one 'period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. Deferred tax assets are not recognised unless there is a virtual certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realised.

11) Earning Per Share:

Earning Per Share is calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity share share holders by the weighted average number of the equity shares outstanding during the period.
