Ex-SC judge to head inquiry commission

NEW DELHI: The Union home ministry on Thursday appointed Justice Balbir Singh Chauhan as chairperson of the three-member Commission of Inquiry (CoI) formed on June 4, 2023, to investigate the ethnic violence in Manipur.

Chauhan, a former justice of the Supreme Court, will take charge on March 1, as the chairperson, according to a government notification, which said that the government accepted the resignation of the current chairperson, justice Ajal Lamba (retired).

A person aware of the matter said that retired justice Lamba resigned due to personal reasons. "The Inquiry is at a crucial juncture, where physical evidence and statements will be recorded in New Delhi. This will involve the presence of all committee members at the New Delhi office everyday. Due to some personal issues related to

logistics and travel, which had nothing to do with the Inquiry, the retired judge resigned from the inquiry. The resignation has been accepted."

The Union home ministry notification stated: "The Central Government hereby appoints Honorable Justice Balbir Singh Chauhan, former Justice in the Supreme Court of India, w.e.f. 01.03.2026, as Chairperson of the Commission of Inquiry in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section 3 of section (3) of the Commissions of Inquiry Act, 1952 (60 of 1952)."

SC directs sharing of probe report with victims

Meanwhile, the Supreme Court on Thursday directed the final investigation reports in the Manipur violence cases probed by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) to be shared with the victims after their families committed of being kept in the dark since their matters were shifting out to Assam in August 2023.

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"PLATFORMS MUST SHARE REVENUE..."

In some cases, such as print media, by statutory bodies, digital and social media platform have enjoyed safe harbour as intermediaries, although their primary revenue source is the same as that of media companies -- advertising. Much of the content they amplify using algorithms is also generated by or curated from traditional media or individual content creators, who aren't usually compensated for the use of their content. Vaishnav's comments suggest that India may be considering a regulatory reset to address these issues.

The challenges, Vaishnav said, make this "an inflection point in the entire world of media". And "whatever we decide today, lays the foundation of tomorrow," he added later in his speech.

In his speech, Vaishnav also singled out synthetic content -- deepfakes and other such -- that has "no correlation with reality" and which "directly challenge societal trust".

The internet makes it possible for such content to reach consumers.

"The internet has become a powerful media outlet," the minister said.

Platforms have dodged responsibility for such content but that is no longer sustainable, Vaishnav said.

"Are they promoting fake content? Are they causing harm to children? These are questions platforms must now answer."

His remarks come amid global and domestic moves to regulate digital content and platform responsibility. Australia's News Media and Digital Platforms Mandatory Bargaining Code, enacted in 2021, requires large digital platforms to negotiate with news publishers and compensate them for news content made available on their services, in an effort to address bargaining power imbalances and support the sustainability of journalism.

The system has resulted in numerous commercial agreements between platforms and local media organisations since its introduction.

"Social media platforms must also share revenue in a fair way with the people who are creating the content, whether it is news persons, the conventional

media, the creators sitting in far-flung areas, influencers, the professors and researchers who are disseminating their work using the platforms," Vaishnav said, adding that "everywhere the principle now has to be set right and there has to be a fair share of revenue with the people who are creating the content."

It will be sure, this concerns not just digital and social media platforms but also large language models of Artificial Intelligence companies that are trained on the content created by media companies and individuals. In the US and Europe, some AI companies have entered into arrangements with media companies where they pay the latter for the use of their content.

Meanwhile, states like Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka in India are exploring restrictions on children's use of social media and mobile phones below age 16, citing concerns about addiction, mental health and exposure to harmful content, with Karnataka's chief minister Siddaramaiah noting such measures are being discussed "in line with various other countries."

Australia has such a ban in place and France is considering one.
