Fire breaks out in NICU at Govt Daga Hospital

Nagpur, May 14 (UNI) A fire broke out in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) of the Government Daga Women's Hospital here on Thursday morning, triggering panic among hospital authorities, staff and relatives of patients. However, all newborn babies admitted to the ward were safely evacuated in time, averting a major tragedy.

According to hospital sources, the incident occurred around 10 am in the Special Newborn Care Unit (SNCU), where nearly 38 infants were undergoing treatment. Preliminary reports suggest that the fire may have been caused by a short circuit, which led to heavy smoke inside the ward. As soon as the smoke was detected, doctors, nurses and hospital staff launched an immediate rescue operation and shifted all newborn babies to safer locations.

Some infants were moved to other wards within Daga Hospital, while several others were shifted to Mayo Hospital as a precautionary measure.

No casualties or injuries were reported in the incident. Hospital authorities said the prompt action by the medical and support staff helped prevent any loss of life.

The sudden spread of smoke created panic among relatives present at the hospital premises.

Security personnel and the hospital administration later brought the situation under control. An inquiry has been initiated to ascertain the exact cause of the fire.

Officials said though a short circuit is suspected in the preliminary investigation, the exact reason would be confirmed only after the final report. The incident has once again raised concerns over fire safety measures and emergency preparedness in government hospitals.

Sunetra Pawar demands equal ward funds for NCP on par with BJP corporators

Mumbai, May 14 (UNI) Deputy Chief Minister Sunetra Pawar has written a letter to Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis demanding that corporators of the Ajit Pawar-founded NCP must get an equal amount of development funds for their wards, as much as BJP corporators receive.

According to sources, she wrote to Chief Minister Fadnavis demanding equal development funds after it came to light that each ruling BJP corporator in the Pune Municipal Corporation received Rs 7 crores to develop their municipal wards while corporators from her party received only Rs 5 crores each from the municipal budget. In her letter to Chief Minister Fadnavis, she appealed that development funds must be disbursed

based on PM Modi's principle of "Sab Ka Saat, Sabka Vikas", without any political biases, preferential treatment or discrimination.

Deputy CM Sunetra Pawar also demanded in her letter to Fadnavis that all wards in Pune city should get equal development funds without giving preferential treatment to any one part of the city.

She emphasised in her letter to the Chief Minister that if any ward gets a skewed amount of funds, citizens of those areas may get deprived of basic amenities.

"In accordance with the principle of 'Sabka Saat, Sabka Vikas', it is requested that appropriate instructions be given to the concerned parties so that all corporators.

Amboli-Velunje Flow Diversion Scheme gets cabinet nod

Nashik, May 14 (UNI)

During a cabinet meeting held today, approval was granted for a budgetary provision of ₹49.26 crore for the Amboli-Velunje Flow Diversion Scheme in Nashik district.

The meeting was presided over by Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis. This project is set to bring 165 hectares of land under irrigation. The Amboli-Velunje Flow Diversion Scheme is proposed on a stream of the Val River within the Daman Ganga basin. Through this scheme, water currently flowing westward will be diverted eastward into the Godavari basin. The project is expected to make 32.04 million cubic feet (MCFT) of water available.

Of this total, 4.83 MCFT has been allocated for local consumption, while plans are in place to divert the remaining 27.21 MCFT into the Godavari basin using a flow-based method.

Out of the total Rs 49.26 crore, Rs 46 crore has been sanctioned for actual construction works, while Rs 3.26 crore has been approved for ancillary works. The Godavari Marathwada Irrigation Development Corporation is tasked with the process of assigning a unique infrastructure ID to the project.

The approved budget allocation includes provisions of Rs 13.46 crore for land acquisition, Rs 24.33 crore for construction works, Rs 3.90 crore for bridges, Rs 32 lakh for buildings, Rs 3.70 crore for connectivity and access roads, Rs 15 lakh for tree plantation, ₹12 lakh for maintenance, and ₹1.70 lakh for miscellaneous expenses.

Fadnavis slams opposition over 'double standards' on fuel conservation debate

Mumbai, May 14 (UNI) Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis on Thursday criticised opposition parties over the ongoing debate surrounding fuel conservation measures, accusing them of displaying what he described as a "double standard" approach on the issue. In a post shared on social media platform X, Fadnavis stated in Marathi and Hindi that the opposition's "hypocritical behaviour" and "double attitude" regarding fuel-saving initiatives were not appropriate. The post, shared through his official

X handle along with a video from Mumbai, carried hashtags linked to Maharashtra and Mumbai.

Although the Chief Minister did not directly mention any specific opposition leader or political party in the post, the remarks came amid continuing political exchanges over recent appeals relating to fuel conservation and reduction in fuel consumption. The issue has generated political debate in recent days after comments and reactions from opposition leaders questioning calls for

austerity and fuel-saving measures, while simultaneously criticising government expenditure patterns. Political observers viewed Fadnavis's remarks as part of the continuing confrontation between the ruling Mahayuti alliance and opposition parties in Maharashtra over governance, public expenditure and economic issues. The Chief Minister has frequently used social media platforms to respond to criticism from opposition leaders and to defend policies and public messaging associated with the state and central

governments.

The latest remarks also come at a time when discussions relating to fuel conservation, rising economic pressures and public expenditure have increasingly entered mainstream political discourse across the country. The short but pointed message posted by Fadnavis quickly drew reactions from supporters and opposition workers online, further intensifying the political debate surrounding fuel-saving appeals and governance priorities.

Central govt's decision to ban sugar exports is foolish: Raju Shetty

Kolhapur, May 14 (UNI) Swabhimani Shetkari Sanghatana (SSS) leader and former MP Raju Shetty has voiced anger over the central government's decision to ban sugar exports, which will directly affect sugarcane producer farmers. He has termed the decision as "unwise" and "foolish".

The central government on Wednesday imposed a ban on sugar exports with immediate effect till September 30 or until further orders.

There is a possibility of a decline in sugar production in the country. Against this backdrop, the aim of the centre's decision is to keep domestic sugar prices under control and ensure adequate domestic sugar supply.

Reacting sharply, Shetty said, "Mother won't eat and father won't let me beg", which is the situation of the sugar industry and sugarcane farmers. In the last four years, the central government has not increased the minimum selling price (MSP) of sugar. "It is true that sugar production in the country has decreased. If sugar is getting a good price in the global market, then why shouldn't sugar factories export sugar? You yourself are not increasing the price and you are banning factories from exporting sugar. What is the central government's logic behind this?", he asked.

"These decisions are having a direct impact on sugarcane farmers. The fight between us and the sugar factories is that the

farmers should get the maximum share of the money generated from the sugar produced from sugarcane and its by-products.

"But the prices of sugar have not increased. Due to this, the debts of sugarcane farmers worth about Rs 12,000 crore are outstanding in the state. Who is responsible for this?", he continued.

"If sugar mills are left, this will have a direct impact on sugarcane farmers. On the one hand, the prices of chemical fertilizers have skyrocketed. The Prime Minister is saying to reduce the use of chemical fertilizers. On the other hand, mills are not ready to pay. What should farmers do?," said Shetty.

Bus overturns near Malegaon; 3 including driver, seriously injured

Nashik, May 14 (UNI) A tragic road accident happened today in the Nashik district of Maharashtra, where a passenger bus travelling from Pune to Shahada lost control, collided with a tree, and overturned. The bus involved belongs to the Shahada Depot and Dhule Division (Registration No. MH 14 MH 2310). In the accident, three people—including the driver—sustained serious injuries, while seven other passengers suffered minor injuries.

According to reports, the bus was on its regular scheduled journey along the Pune-Shahada route. Due to heavy traffic congestion on the Chondi Ghat road leading from Manmad, the driver decided to alter the route and proceed toward Malegaon via Gimare. When the bus reached a point approximately 500 metres past the Umrana area in Malegaon Taluka of the district, it suddenly went out of control and veered off the road. Due to excessive speed, the bus crashed directly into a tree and overturned.

Two youths drowned at the Salaimendha lake in Nagpur

Nagpur, May 14 (UNI) Two youths drowned while swimming with friends in a tragic incident at the Salaimendha lake under jurisdiction of Hingna tehsil of Maharashtra's Nagpur district, police said on Thursday.

According to police, the incident occurred on Wednesday afternoon when five friends had gone to the lake to spend their holiday time. During the outing, two of them entered the water for swimming but reportedly moved into deep waters and drowned.

The deceased were identified as Aditya Ramchandra Chahande (19), a resident of Rajivnagar MIDC and Abhishek Amirchand Sirsam (19), originally from Sindwada and presently residing at Nildoh in Hingna. Both were employed with Ramson Company.

Sources said the group had gone out in the afternoon as they were scheduled for night duty on Wednesday. At around 3.30 pm, Aditya and Abhishek entered the lake for swimming but began drowning due to the water depth. Their friends raised an alarm for help, but none of them knew swimming.

On receiving information through emergency helpline number 112, Hingna police and the Nagpur Municipal Corporation fire brigade rushed to the spot and launched a rescue operation. After several hours of search, the bodies of both youths were recovered from the lake at around 7 pm and shifted to the Rural Hospital in Hingna.
