NRAI steps up fire safety push following Goa club tragedy

TASK FORCE PLANNED TO GUIDE RESTAURANTS ON NORMS; FRESH ADVISORIES IN THE WORKS

The National Restaurant Association of India (NRAI) on Monday said it will ramp up advisories to members on complying with fire safety standards, while also setting up a committee to look into the same.

"We issue advisories very regularly and are in the process of devising another one, warning members against the harms of taking fire safety for granted.

What happened in Goa was very unfortunate and has led to the loss of many lives, including those from the industry," Sagar Daryani, president of the NRAI and co-founder and chief executive officer, Wow! Momo, told Business Standard.

Police check safety measures at bars, restaurants in Noida, Gurugram

NOIDA/GURUGRAM: In the wake of the deadly fire at a nightclub in Goa on Saturday that claimed 25 lives, police in Noida and Gurugram have launched intensive inspection drives at bars, restaurants and entertainment venues across the districts to review public safety measures, officials said on Tuesday.

Around 50 bars, restaurants and similar establishments located in different police station areas of the Gautam Buddh Nagar Police Commissionerate have been inspected, officials said.

The inspections in Gautam Buddh Nagar are being carried out under the leadership of the Chief Fire Officer (CFO) by teams comprising personnel from the Fire Service Department, Excise Department and Electrical Safety Department, with the objective of identifying and promptly rectifying any short-

comings related to fire and electrical safety.

Chief Fire Officer Pradeep Kumar said the inspections are focusing on key safety aspects, including the availability and proper functioning of emergency exit doors, the presence and validity of fire safety equipment such as fire alarms and extinguishers, and electrical safety measures.

"Electrical wiring, earthing, load management and the safe condition of electrical equipment are being checked in detail," Kumar said, adding that teams are also verifying the condition and functionality of ventilation and smoke management systems, adherence to prescribed occupancy limits, crowd control arrangements, safe handling of gas cylinders, and the validity of licences and statutory approvals.

gaps," Daryani added.

The move comes after a

nightclub in Goa's Arpora caught fire on Saturday night, killing 25 people, including 20 staff members. According to reports, police officers stated that the venue was not complying with fire safety norms and did not have any fire emergency exit in the basement.

"It is important to adhere to fire safety norms, which includes things like working fire extinguishers, wide staircases, and keeping second exits clear. However, these things are hardly followed through," said an industry executive who did not wish to be identified.

This is not the first such instance. In 2017, a blaze at a bar in Mumbai's shopping and restaurant complex Kamala Mills killed 15 people. Recently, in Kolkata, too, the Kolkata Municipal Corporation ordered the closure of all rooftop restaurants in the city.

PM-led committee to select information commissioners today

A three-member committee headed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and also including Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi is likely to meet on Wednesday to decide the next Chief Information Commissioner and information commissioners for eight vacant positions at the Central Information Commission (CIC).

The government had informed the Supreme Court on December 1 that the prime minister Modi-led panel is likely to meet on December 10 to select and recommend names for these posts.

Under Section 12 (3) of the Right to Information Act, the prime minister is the chairperson of the committee, which also comprises the leader of opposition and a Union minister nominated by the prime minister, that selects and recommends the names for appointment as Chief Information Commissioner and information commissioners.

According to the Act, the CIC has a Chief Information Commissioner and 10 Information Commissioners who adjudicate complaints and appeals filed by the applicants against the unsatisfactory orders of government officials on their applications.

Karnataka Legislative Council Speaker Basavaraj Horatti announced that Wednesday's entire sitting of the ongoing 157th Legislative Council session of the bicameral Karnataka State Legislature in Belagavi will be devoted to a full-day special debate on the pressing issues of Kittur-Karnataka (Belgaum Region) and Kalyana-Karnataka, with a sharp focus on the long-disputed Kalasa-Bhandura and Mhadai water diversion projects.

The highest appellate authority to adjudicate-related complaints and appeals had gone headless for the seventh time since 2014 after incumbent Chief Information Commissioner Heeralal Samariya demitted office on September 13.

The Commission had become headless for the first time after then CIC Rajiv Mathur demitted office in August 2014.

Samariya, who had become the Chief Information Commissioner on November 6, 2023, demitted office on attaining the age of 65 years, according to an office order issued by the Commission.

In a response to activist Commodore Lokesh Batra (retired), the department of personnel and training had said that 83 applications were received for the post of Chief Information Commissioner in response to its advertisement issued on May 21.

It also said that 161 applications were received in response to an advertisement issued on August 14, 2024, for the vacancies against the post of information commissioners in the CIC.
