Telangana Govt launches AI-powered Weather Advisory Service for farmers



Hyderabad, May 30 (UNI)

The Telangana Government on Saturday launched the 'Telangana Weather Advisory Programme, an artificial intelligence-driven initiative aimed at providing farmers with timely weather updates and scientific agricultural advisories to help improve crop management and reduce climate-related risks. The programme was formally inaugurated at the State Secre-

tarial by Agriculture Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao. The initiative is being implemented by the Agriculture Department in collaboration with Development Innovation Lab India and Evidence Action. A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between the three organisations on the occasion. Addressing the gathering, Tummala Nageswara Rao said that climate change was

delivered directly to farmers through WhatsApp. The Minister said AI-powered weather forecasting would help farmers take timely cultivation decisions, minimise crop losses and improve productivity. He added that the programme would contribute to enhancing farmers' incomes and promoting climate-resilient agricultural practices. Following the launch, the Minister sent the first weather advisory message to farmers through WhatsApp, providing information on the upcoming monsoon season and expected rainfall conditions. He also suggested that the platform be upgraded to enable farmers to raise queries related to weather and farming practices through voice messages and receive appropriate responses. He urged the implementing agencies to develop the technology further and extend the service from the mandal level to villages. Speaking through a video conference from New Delhi, Evidence Action Country Director Ankur Garg briefed the Minister on the organisation's AI-based programmes designed to support farmers. He said the initiative would ben-

efit lakhs of farmers across Telangana and expressed the organisation's commitment to expanding farmer-centric services in partnership with the State Government. Agriculture Secretary K. Surendra Mohan said Telangana was at the forefront of adopting modern technologies in agriculture. He said the initiative aligned with the State's Telangana Rising-2047 vision and would help deliver more effective weather-based advisory services through artificial intelligence. He noted that the AI-powered system could provide timely information to help farmers adapt to weather-related challenges, including climatic phenomena such as El Niño, and adopt suitable farming practices. The service will initially be provided through WhatsApp to around 1.5 million farmers across 304 mandals in 17 districts whose mobile numbers are registered under the Rythu Bharosa database. The programme launch was attended by Director of Agriculture B. Gopi, Special Commissioner for Cooperation Rahul Raj, senior government officials and representatives of the partner organisations.

Telangana Eagle Force SP Warns Youth Against Rising Tobacco, Nicotine Addiction



Hyderabad, May 30 (UNI)

Telangana Eagle Force Superintendent of Police P. Seetharam today cautioned young people against falling prey to the growing appeal of tobacco and nicotine products, which are increasingly being marketed in attractive forms to target younger audiences. He was addressing an awareness programme organised at Kamineni Hospitals ahead of World No Tobacco Day, observed annually on May 31. Inaugurating the programme, Seetharam said tobacco use posed a serious threat not only to individual health but also to the future of families and society. He urged young people to stay away from addictive substances and adopt healthy lifestyles. He stressed that parents, teachers and community leaders must work together to spread awareness about the harmful effects of tobacco and promote tobacco-free living as part of efforts to build a healthier society. Speaking on the occasion, senior consultant pulmonologist Subhakar Kandi said this year's World No Tobacco Day theme, "Unmasking the Appeal - Countering Nicotine and Tobacco Addiction," aimed to expose the marketing strategies used to promote nicotine and tobacco products among young people. He noted that flavoured products, attractive packaging and social media campaigns often portray ad-

dition as fashionable while concealing its harmful effects. Tobacco consumption, he said, significantly increases the risk of cancer, cardiovascular diseases, stroke and respiratory illnesses. Dr Kandi also highlighted the dangers of passive smoking, which exposes family members and others to serious health risks. Consultant pulmonologist E. Ravindra Reddy said millions of people worldwide lose their lives every year due to tobacco-related diseases. Smoking is a major risk factor for chronic bronchitis, emphysema, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) and lung cancer, besides increasing the likelihood of heart attacks, strokes, hypertension and cancers affecting multiple organs, he said. Dispelling the misconception that smokeless tobacco products are safer, Dr Ravindra Reddy said chewing tobacco remains one of the leading causes of oral cancer in India. He further warned that passive smoking could have severe consequences for children, elderly persons and pregnant women. However, he noted that the health benefits.

Saifabad Police Bust Interstate Ganja Trafficking Racket; Two Women Arrested



Hyderabad, May 30 (UNI)

Saifabad police have busted an interstate ganja trafficking racket by arresting two women who allegedly transported narcotic substances from Andhra Pradesh to Maharashtra and seized 21.251 kg of ganja worth several lakhs of rupees, police said today. Acting on a specific information, a special police team conducted surveillance near the Lakdikapul Railway Station parking area in the city on Friday evening and intercepted two women carrying three luggage bags near a private travels parking facil-

ity. The women were subjected to a search in accordance with provisions of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act. Police said 19 packets containing 21.251 kg of ganja were recovered from the luggage bags. The arrested women were identified as Tippigiri Laxmi alias Bugamma (43), a native of Narayanpet district (Telangana) presently residing in Mumbai, and Sandipkaur Makkhan Singh (60), a resident of Mumbai. During interrogation, the accused allegedly confessed that they had procured the contraband

from a supplier identified as Srinu in Visakhapatnam and were transporting it to Mumbai for sale and distribution. They also reportedly disclosed the involvement of two associates, identified as Baby and Sampath, who are currently absconding. Police seized the ganja, three luggage bags used for transportation and two mobile phones allegedly used in the illegal operation. A case has been registered under Sections 8(c), 20(b)(ii)(C), 27A and 29 of the NDPS Act, and further investigation is underway. The accused were produced before a court and sent to judicial custody. Efforts are on to apprehend the absconding suspects and trace the larger interstate drug trafficking network, police said. The operation was carried out under the supervision of Assistant Commissioner of Police R. Sanjay Kumar, Station House Officer A. Seethiah, Additional Inspector N. Rajender and Sub-Inspector M. Swamy, along with other police personnel of Saifabad Police Station.

DGP calls for comprehensive reforms in Telangana Police; announces new specialised wings

Hyderabad, May 30 (UNI)

Telangana Director General of Police (DGP) C. V. Anand today called for comprehensive reforms in the police department to ensure effective maintenance of law and order and delivery of accountable, citizen-centric policing services across the State. Addressing a high-level video conference with Police Commissioners, Superintendents of Police (SPs), Deputy Superintendents of Police (DSPs), Assistant Commissioners of Police (ACPs), Circle Inspectors (CIs) and Sub-Inspectors (SIs) on the theme "Adoption of Effective Policing Standards", the DGP said the police force must adapt to changing social conditions and emerging challenges in line with the State Government's expectations. He stressed the need to eliminate negligence, indiscipline, rule violations and corruption within the department and called for improvements in service delivery and accountability at all levels. Referring

to the decline of Maoist and Naxalite activity over the past 15 years, Anand said the time had come to reassess and reorganise specialised units such as the Greyhounds and the Special Intelligence Branch (SIB) to better address present-day policing requirements. The DGP directed officers to intensify efforts against narcotics and cybercrime, describing them as major threats to society. He announced that a dedicated Traffic Management and Road Safety Bureau would soon be established to improve traffic regulation and road safety across Telangana. He also revealed plans to create a Food Adulteration Wing to safeguard public health and strengthen the Vigilance and Enforcement Department to prevent revenue losses to the government. Emphasising the importance of women's safety and prevention of child trafficking, Anand instructed officers to further strengthen Bharosa Centres and SHE Teams.

Goa, Sikkim Symbolise India's Rich Diversity: Telangana Governor Shukla

Hyderabad, May 30 (UNI)

Telangana Governor Shiv Pratap Shukla today said that Goa and Sikkim stand as symbols of India's rich diversity and cultural heritage. Participating in the Statehood Day celebrations of Goa and Sikkim at Lok Bhavan here along with his wife Janaki Shukla, the Governor said the Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat initiative was playing a vital role in strengthening national integration and fostering greater understanding among States. Shukla highlighted the cultural, historical and developmental achievements

of Goa and Sikkim and said such celebrations provide an opportunity for people from different regions to appreciate India's diversity while reinforcing the spirit of unity. He noted that the Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat programme has been promoting closer ties among States through cultural exchanges and mutual learning, thereby contributing to the vision of a stronger and more united nation. The Governor extended his greetings to the people of Goa and Sikkim on their Statehood Day celebrations and called upon citizens to

further strengthen the values of national unity, integrity, and social harmony. Messages from the Governor of Sikkim, Om Prakash Mathur, and the Governor of Goa, Puspapati Ashok Gajapathi Raju, were displayed on a digital screen during the programme. Cultural performances presented on the occasion drew appreciation from the audience. Among those present were Special Chief Secretary to the Governor M. Dana Kishore, Joint Secretary Shashikiran Achari and Members of the Goa and Sikkim communities residing in Telangana.

Palamuru Irrigation Projects to be taken up on mission mode



Mahabubnagar, May 30 (UNI)

Telangana Irrigation Minister N. Uttam Kumar Reddy on Saturday said the Congress government would take up irrigation development in the erstwhile Mahabubnagar district on a mission mode and complete all pending projects to transform the drought-prone Palamuru region into a prosperous agricultural hub. Announcing a two-day tour of major irrigation projects by Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on June 4 and 5, Uttam said an intensive ground-level review would be conducted to assess the progress of ongoing works, land acquisition requirements and rehabili-

tation issues. Speaking after laying the foundation stone for the Ajilapur Lift Irrigation Scheme in Devarakadra mandal, the Minister said the government was prepared to release all necessary funds to expedite pending irrigation works and remove bottlenecks affecting project execution. The Chief Minister's tour will cover the Palamuru-Rangareddy Lift Irrigation Scheme, Nentempadu Lift Irrigation Scheme, Koilsagar Project, Bheema Lift Irrigation Scheme and Kalwakurthy Lift Irrigation Scheme, the Minister informed. Uttam alleged that several irrigation projects in the Palamuru region remained incomplete

despite the previous BRS government being in power for a decade. He claimed that inadequate priority had been accorded to irrigation projects in the region and accused the previous government of focusing primarily on the Kaleshwaram project. Rejecting claims that the Palamuru-Rangareddy project was nearly complete before the change of government, he said not a single acre had received irrigation benefits under the project when the Congress government assumed office and asserted that work had gained momentum since then. The Minister said the Ajilapur Lift Irrigation Scheme, being executed at a cost of Rs 32 crore, would provide irrigation facilities to around 1,400 acres in Ajilapur, Gaddagudem and Venkatayapalli villages. The project will draw water from the Koilsagar Balancing Reservoir and utilise about 65 MCFT of water for irrigation purposes. He congratulated Devarakadra MLA G. Madhusudhan Reddy for his efforts in securing the project and said it would provide substantial benefits to farmers in the area.
