PCL cuts distribution losses to 13.04%, AT&C losses to 17.83%

No. Of Feeders Increased From 18,351 To 21,463

Lucknow: Uttar Pradesh Power Corporation Limited (UPPCL) has reported a decline in distribution and aggregate technical and commercial (AT&C) losses over the past five years, alongside an increase in the number of profitable feeders.

According to UPPCL data, distribution losses declined from 20.63% in 2020-21 to 13.04% in 2025-26, while AT&C losses fell from 31.19% to 17.83% during the same period.

Excluding agricultural feeders, the number of feeders increased from 18,351 to 21,463, while those classified as profitable rose from 5,772

to 8,101. Their share increased from 31% to 38%.

Among discoms, Paschimanchal Vidyut Vitran Nigam recorded the highest proportion of profitable feeders at 53%, followed by KE-SCO at 38%, Dakshinanchal and Madhyanchal stood at 37% each and Purvanchal at 22%.

UPPCL said its high-loss cluster initiative covers 703 clusters comprising 1,703 feeders, 42.21 lakh consumers and 76,839 distribution transformers. Under the exercise, Rs 694.31 crore in outstanding dues was recovered and 1,01,548 new electricity con-

nections were issued.

In Dakshinanchal, distribution losses declined from 25.64% to 14.78%, while AT&C losses fell from 31.63% to 19.57%.

UPPCL attributed the changes to feeder-level monitoring, data-based reviews, recovery of dues and greater accountability of field officials. It said losses on the top 10 high-loss feeders in Agra, Mathura, Chitrakoot, Raebareilly and Kosi declined by about 21%, from Rs 22.53 crore to Rs 17.89 crore.

However, UP Rajya Vidyut Ubbhokta Parishad president and state advisory committee member Avadhesh Kumar Verma said the figures raised questions over the rationale for the proposed privatisation of electricity distribution in 12 districts. Verma said the reduction

in distribution losses from 20.63% to 13.04% and AT&C losses from 31.19% to 17.83% showed that state-owned discoms could improve performance without privatisation. He cited monitoring of high-loss feeders, action against power theft and improved revenue collection as measures that had delivered results.

He demanded that the proposed privatisation of Dakshinanchal and Purvanchal discoms be dropped and sought a high-level probe into the process through which the privatisation proposal covering 42 districts was prepared.

Verma also argued that lower losses should eventually benefit consumers through tariffs. He said UPPCL should reflect the improved efficiency while filing its ARR and tariff proposal for 2027-28 and sought a review of the Rs 27,342-crore smart meter project.

Leopard injures three-year-old girl in Bahraich

Lucknow: A three-year-old girl was seriously injured after a leopard entered the courtyard of a house and attacked her in Pujari Purva Jada village in Bahraich on Sunday evening, police said.

The incident took place around 7 pm when the child's mother, Anita, was filling water from a tap in the courtyard. The girl was standing behind her when the leopard suddenly pounced on her.

The animal reportedly grabbed the girl and ran towards nearby fields. Shocked by the attack, Anita raised an alarm, prompting villagers to rush to the spot carrying sticks.

As villagers chased the leopard, it abandoned the child in a field and fled.

After searching for nearly 30 minutes, villagers found the injured girl in a field about 400 metres from her home.

State records addl increase of \$40 lakh

State govt's three-year excise export policy 2026-29 focuses on enhancing the state's production capacity and promoting exports. In the first quarter of financial year 2026-27, the state's excise exports recorded a growth of 45.4% compared to the corresponding period of the previous year.

UP's excise exports reached USD 127.8 lakh during April-June 2026, compared to USD 87.9 lakh during the same period last year. In other words, the state recorded an additional increase of about USD 39.9 lakh. However, the nearly USD 5 lakh in foreign exchange earned from molasses exports from Basti is additional to these figures because of its separate tariff classification.

en farmers and exporters. It is supported by an entire chain involving processing, packaging, storage, transportation, and logistics. As exports increase, economic activity in all these sectors is also expected to grow.

Excise commissioner Adarsh Singh said that the impact of rising exports in the state is not limited to excise units alone. The upstream segment of the industry is linked to agricultural products such as sugarcane, molasses, and grains, while downstream sectors include glass bottles, packaging caps, labelling, storage and transportation.

UP 112 response vehicles roll out legal-aid msg

Lucknow: The next time a UP 112 police response vehicle (PRV) arrives in a village or a remote locality, it may carry more than an emergency callout.

From Monday, PRVs in Lucknow have been deployed to spread awareness about ways to settle pending disputes through the National Lok Adalat scheduled for Sept 12 and the Mediation 3.0 drive, offering alternatives to prolonged litigation.

In a joint initiative between Lucknow police commissioner and District Legal Services Authority (DLSA), PRVs were flagged off from the Lucknow district court premises.

District Judge and DLSA chairman Malkhan Singh and the police's National Lok Adalat nodal officer Kiran Yadav launched the campaign to take legal awareness messages to the city outskirts, villages and hard-to-reach areas.

Mental health cells in higher education instts

Lucknow: In an attempt to promote the mental well-being of students, the UP government is set to introduce a Student Mental Health and Well-Being Policy for all higher education institutions across the state.

The initiative aims to provide students with a safe, supportive and stress-free academic environment while addressing growing concerns related to mental health among youth. According to officials, the policy seeks to ensure timely support for students facing academic pressure, examination anxiety, career-related stress and emotional challenges.

The government is working to establish a coordinated mental health support system at the state, district and institutional levels to make counselling and specialist services more accessible, said a government spokesperson.

Under the proposed framework, the higher education director will serve as the nodal and implementing authority at the state level, while a steering committee headed by the principal secretary, Higher Education, will oversee implementation, budget allocation and periodic review. District-level committees under the chairmanship of district magistrates will monitor and coordinate related activities in universities and colleges.

One of the key features of the policy is the establishment of a Mental Health Support Cell in every HEL. These cells will provide students with confidential counselling services and connect them with psychologists and other specialists whenever required. The government is also working to introduce an online mental health portal offering preliminary assessment and support facilities, officials said.
